Pastor Joyce's Message

We are entering the month of March. From Thesarus.com here is some information. Where did the name *March* come from? The name March is ultimately derived from the Latin word Martius (named after Mars, the Roman god of war). Martius was the name of the first month in the original Roman calendar. Along with January, May, and June, March is one of several months named after a god. The Roman ruler, Numa Pompilius, is traditionally credited with adding January and February to the calendar, thus making March the third month of the year. While many have adopted this calendar (the Gregorian calendar), some cultures and religions still celebrate the start of the new year on March 1. In Iran, New Year's Day is celebrated on March 21. This month we begin to look toward change in the weather and also change in our life in Christ. Pastor

Ken Simmuro of the Foothills conference, in his sermon on the occasion of Pr. Lowell Chilton's installation at First Lutheran, offered words that resound with March. This month enters with cold and snow and is the forerunner of spring. Change is in the air. Pastor Simmuro spoke of the changes the Christian Church is offering: the next step in our moving ahead is an opportunity to examine our response to Christ's message in today's world. No looking back and asking for everything to remain as it was is the mantra. Christ's message of salvation never changes and how we hear it and observe following the message is always in a time of looking at our situation in life. Look around Good Shepherd and see the changes that keep occurring and know that Christ is ever and always the same.

This is the message as we prepare for the time of Easter. Blessings and joy...even if it is cold outside, Christ will warm us up.

The Lenten Season in 2023

- Lent begins each year on Ash Wednesday, 46 days before Easter Sunday. This year Lent started on February 22, 2023; and if you are following the 40 days tradition, Lent will then end on Holy Saturday, April 8th, 2023.
- Lent can be helpful for families, in the same way, that Advent helps parents prepare their children for Christmas. The season of Lent provides an opportunity for families to strengthen spiritual discipline together. In addition to engaging in the distraction of the baskets and egg hunts, Lent can help your family focus on the real meaning of Easter and what Jesus' sacrifice means for our salvation.

The Ministry Site Profile (MSP) has been completed by the Call Committee and posted at the Synod. Rachel Sosebee, from the Synod, met with the Call Committee and Executive Council on January 31. Rachel complimented the work performed on the MSP. She also stated that she and Julie Grindle are actively looking at candidates for a pastor at Good Shepherd.

We were advised that the next step is to have a mock interview with a local Pastor (often the Dean) before they interview the date is scheduled for the first candidate. This is a growing practice so some people are not familiar with this step.

The Call Committee has put together a list of interview questions for when a candidate is selected for us. We have also reached out to Rev Jo Page, Dean, to select a date and time for the mock interview.

Respectfully submitted, Steve Layne, Chair The new Fire Smart Omni series TV's are up and running. It is very easy to launch Zoom with the remote or you can always ask Alexa to launch Zoom. In the



sanctuary we have a 65 inch TV and in the Library there is a 43 inch TV. The 65 inch TV in the Sanctuary will be on during all services and this will allow the people at home to be able to see the congregation in their seats from the front. We will no longer be displaying the bulletin because it doesn't always look in focus to the people on Zoom. Both TV's can be moved into another area of needed as they are on a stand with wheels. No computer is necessary to launch Zoom on the TV's and both work exactly the same way.

We now have a square account with a credit card reader that connects to t he GSLCL iPad. This allows us to accept credit/debit cards at any of the future events. The money that is collected on the credit card reader goes into a GSLCL Square account and can be transferred at any time to the GSLCL checking account at no charge. This has already proved to be successful.


neighborhood. Our members put most of their soup cans behind the Kansas City Chiefs who won this year's Super Bowl. Again, thank you for your donations of canned soups!

Community Food Pantry

As you may know or not know, Good Shepherd for the past year has had a food box in the parking lot filled with nonperishable food items for people that are in need of food. People are coming and getting food from the box which is a great thing but



food from the box which is a great thing but we are now at a point that it is sometimes difficult keeping the box filled. The Outreach and Evangelism Ministry team will oversee the food box and make sure it is filled with food. The team decided to use \$200 from the Summer Lunch Program to purchase food for the box. In addition, Kirsten Andersen has obtained a \$250 Thrivent Action Grant for the food box. However, we are going to need everyone's support in donating food and placing it in the tub in the front hallway for the food box.

Also, another way you could support the food pantry would be putting a monetary donation in a blue envelope that you will find in the narthex which is for designated giving. Just put your name on the blue envelope and put for the Food Pantry. Your support of this food box will be greatly appreciated as we continue this needed and special ministry. A few guidelines though:

- No glass as accidents happen and we do not want glass in the parking lot

- No liquids as these tend to freeze and will get food in the cabinet

- No ready to eat items - snack bars or candy

- No cleaning products - again they may contaminate food

- Diapers, dry formula, powered milk, toilet paper are always needed. But please do not attach receipts to formula or diapers

- Please check to make sure the food is not spoiled or out of date

- Very few canned good will freeze

Suggested items include

- Dried beans, Canned Beef Stew, Cereal, Chef Boyardee, Crackers, Pasta,

- Pepperoni Slices-sealed, Powered Milk, Rice, Rice A Roni, Canned Salmon,

- Dried or Canned Soup, Spaghetti Sauce, Canned Tuna, Canned Vegetables

- Toilet Paper, Dog and Cat food, Kitty Litter
