PASTOR JINNEY'S MESSAGE

Dear Siblings in Christ,

The Christmas season is typically marked by expressions of joy, excitement, and happiness. It's a time for family and friends to gather and for churches to worship pointing to the hope that is found in the coming of the Christ child. However, this time of joy and expectation can often overshadow the pain and hurt that many are experiencing during this season when the world's merriment puts their grief and sorrow in stark relief.

At 6 pm on Friday evening, December 22nd a Blue Christmas Worship Service will be held at GSLC. Also known as the Service of the Longest Night, this liturgy focuses on offering prayers for those for whom this season is not a time of joy. For many people, the approaching Christmas holiday does not bring with it the joy and happiness that is advertised on television or in greeting cards. Dealing with the death of a loved one, facing life after divorce or separation, coping with the loss of a job, lack of or distance from family or friends, living with illness, or perhaps feeling pressured and overwhelmed by holiday preparations can result in parties and joviality becoming painful for many people in our congregations and communities.

One of the most extraordinary acts of pastoral care in the Advent season is to offer a service known as a Service of the Longest Night or a Blue Christmas Worship Service. It is a time of worship and reflection scheduled around the winter solstice (the longest night of the calendar year) and it just happens to fall on or around December 21st every year. Including this service amid the hustle and bustle of your other Christmas services, rituals, parties, and obligations is a tremendous witness to those who are struggling in our communities. It's a witness to them that the Christ child comes as a sign of hope in the face of despair. And it's a witness that their church is intentional about upholding members of the community in whatever season of life they may find themselves in.

This year, GSLC will be worshiping with Pastor Josh Evans and St. John Lutheran Church members during our Blue Christmas Service. All area church members and all members of our community are asked to join us in this sacred gathering.

In addition, as a part of the grant, Patti put out an appeal to ask folks to bring in items for the Christmas at Sea Shoeboxes that we collect for the Albany Maritime Ministry. Another big thanks for that day is to Marjorie Raymond who tabulated all of the financial cards that were received up to Gratitude Sunday. And last but not least a big thank you to all of you who helped clean up after the brunch.

On a few Sundays before Gratitude Sunday, we had a few folks who gave temple talks about the many things that they are thankful for at Good Shepherd. The temple talks were excellent, and we thank Dick Walker and Kiran and Atif Dean for providing these inspirational talks. During one service the children of the Sunday School passed out leaves for each person to write on them what they are thankful for. 

Community Food Pantry

Good Shepherd's food pantry for our community outreach is regularly accessed, so we know it is needed. It is to allow members of our congregation to leave non-perishable food items for those in need. A few guidelines though:

- No glass Accidents happen and we don't want glass in the parking lot.
- No liquids these tend to freeze and will spoil food in the cabinet.
- No ready-to-eat items snack bars or candy.
- No cleaning products again they may contaminate food.
- Diapers, dry formula, powdered milk, toilet paper, are always in need. But please do not attach receipts to formula or diapers.
- Please check to make sure the food is not spoiled or out of date.
- Very few canned goods will freeze.



The many outreach projects of our congregation are made possible in large part by grants from Thrivent Financial. Every Thrivent member is eligible to apply for two \$250.00 Action Team grants per year. These are easy to apply for, and if you need help please ask Danny Patrick.
