A word from the pastor

Grace and peace to you from the one who was and is and is to be. Amen.

When I was a youth in Nashville, we had an Associate Pastor, Laura Hocker, now Laura Barbins, who instilled in me a love of the Easter Vigil. Pastor Laura invited the middle school and high school youth to the church for a lock in on Holy Saturday. But unlike a normal youth group lock in, this one was a prayer vigil. We began outside with a fire and moved into the darkened sanctuary to pray. Throughout the night, every few hours we would gather in the sanctuary to remember God's liberating love as told through the Hebrew Scriptures and to pray together. In between the prayer and reading, we did the usual lockin activities, like board games and too much soda, but every few hours, whoever was still awake went with Pastor Laura to the sanctuary to read and pray. We kept the vigil through the night for the congregation, and in the morning we celebrated the first Eucharist of Easter and had a huge breakfast. Between the fire, the solemnity of the readings, and the liberating love of God proclaimed, I was hooked. I even started a similar tradition as a youth group leader in Seattle before seminary.

Historically, the Easter Vigil has been a time of celebration and of remembering; of telling of what God has done, of noticing what God is doing, and of praying for God to do it all again. Since the early days of the church, Christians have gathered to keep watch at the tomb and to celebrate the discovery of the empty tomb. Often, the Vigil was to culmination of an extended period of preparation for baptism and for joining the church.

This year, the four congregations of Albany Lutherans Together are coming together to begin a new local tradition, a shared celebration of the Easter Vigil, hosted by us at Good Shepherd! Don't worry, we aren't staying up all night. We'll begin at dusk around a fire on the patio. We'll process through the building by candlelight and tell

Please let Anita Andersen know if you are interested in joining us. We anticipate the ALT Easter Vigil being a highlight of the year and we hope you'll consider joining the choir.
