#### A word from the Pastor

#### V - YOU SHALL NOT MURDER

#### What is this? or What does this mean?

We are to fear and love God, so that we neither endanger nor harm the lives of our neighbors, but instead help and support them in all life's needs.

- Martin Luther, "The Small Catechism," translated by Timothy J. Wengert, © 1994, 2000, 2008 Augsburg Fortress.

Here at Good Shepherd, we have many charitable works to help and support people in all life's needs. We participate in the CROP Walk, have the Little Food Pantry in the parking lot, give to local and global charities from our fundraisers, collect athletic shoes, prepare meals for the CACC Emergency Overflow Shelter, and support the Albany Maritime Ministry. Still being new to the congregation, I don't even know the fullness of what we do together. This is fantastic. Charitable works are important.

Charitable works go side by side with advocacy to lessen the need for charity. In Catholic Social Teaching there is the concept of <u>The Two Feet of Love in Action</u>. These are: **charitable works (direct service) and social justice (systemic change).** The two feet walk together, meeting the needs of people and addressing the root causes of those needs. We feed people and we advocate for change so that we need to feed people a little less. We house people and we advocate for change so that we need to house people a little less.

Here in New York, this legislative session, we have the chance to make the world a little bit better for a whole lot of people. Approximately half of the world's private sovereign debt, debt owed by countries to private lenders, is controlled by NY law. The Sovereign Debt Stability Act (S.5542-A/A.2970-A) will make it much easier for

countries to restructure their debt. This is a complicated topic, but essentially the bill would make it easier for countries to have a longer payment period with lower interest. This makes it easier for roads and schools to be built, medical and nutrition programs funded, and life made better for the people in these countries. This is just and good. The bill is supported by the Upstate NY Synod, the NY Council of Churches, and Jubilee USA (an interfaith group, of which the ELCA is a member, that advocates for sovereign debt relief globally).

I invite you to join me at the NY Capitol on May 7 for an advocacy day in support of this important legislation. Can't join me but want to advocate? A letter or call to your Assemblymember or Senator is a quick and meaningful way to advocate for real change. Give me a text, email, or call if you're interested in getting involved.

Direct service & systemic change. This is how justice works. This is how we live out the call of our baptism.

# **ALT Outreach Ministry**

# Synod Hunger Appeal – "Loaves and Fishes"

In keeping with this year's celebration of the 50th anniversary of ELCA World Hunger, your Upstate NY Synod's Hunger Justice Team invites you and your congregation to participate in "Loaves and Fishes," inspired by Jesus' miraculous feeding of the 5000 with only five loaves and two small fish (Matthew 14:17-20)

Each congregation in the synod has been challenged to raise at least \$500 for ELCA World Hunger by Synod Assembly, the first week of June. This year's focus is on two programs: *Irrigation Systems (Loaves) and Fish Farms (Fishes).* 

*Irrigation System:* Many farmers around the world rely on rainwater to nourish their crops. When the rain doesn't fall, an entire community can be vulnerable to drought and hunger. Irrigation systems, coupled with training and maintenance, can help vulnerable farmers and their families become more resilient to the impacts of climate change and give them the tools to protect their water supply.

*Fish Farm:* It starts with a pond, training and a few fast-growing fish such as tilapia. Soon the pond can provide the community with a long-term supply of fish, rich in vitamins, minerals and protein.

#### **Celebrating 375 years of First Lutheran Albany**

May 19 – 4 PM – First Lutheran Church, 181 Western Ave, Albany, NY

First Lutheran traces our history to the earliest Lutherans in Fort Orange. In 1649, some Lutherans among the Dutch colonizers, including Andreas Braat ("de Noorman," or "the northman," for whom Normanskill is named), joined with some Lutherans in New Amsterdam (now Manhattan) to request a pastor from Amsterdam. They were denied and continued meeting in house churches and longing for preaching, teaching, baptism, and communion.

On the afternoon of May 19, the Festival of Pentecost, the congregation invites you to join in a festive eucharist and reception celebrating 375 years of following the light of Christ and encountering the grace of the living God in Albany. Worship begins at 4 PM, preservice music beginning about 3:45. A reception follows in Wittenberg Hall.
