Sundays this Summer, the First Reading will come from 1 & 2 Samuel and 1 Kings, the story of David, King of Israel. This is a story of the beauty and tragedy of humanness, of the ways of sin turning us from God and from one another, even when we try our best to do the right thing, and of joy and grace in realtionships that transcend tragedy. This is a story of a people trying to be faithful together, and also longing to "be like the nations," of a people struggling with who they are together as they grow stronger in power and influence. This is a story of God showing up for God's people, calling them forward in love and grace, challenging them to live into the love and grace of God, and still being there when they fall short.

Read along at home between weeks and keep up with the story. There are bookmarks at the church to help keep track of the readings. Or just start with 1 Samuel 1 and keep reading.

Living out our welcome statement, we proclaim God's boundless love and repent of the ways we try to limit that love, that we may build a more just world and a more just church, together.

Commemoration of the Emanuel IX – June 16

On June 17, 2015, Clementa C. Pinckney, Cynthia Marie Graham Hurd, Susie Jackson, Ethel Lee Lance, DePayne Middleton-Doctor, Tywanza Sanders, Daniel Lee Simmons, Sharonda Coleman-Singleton, and Myra Thompson were murdered by a self-professed white supremacist, who was raised in an ELCA congregation, while they were gathered for Bible study and prayer at the Emanuel African Methodist Episcopal Church (often referred to as Mother Emanuel) in Charleston, South Carolina. Pastors Pinckney and Simmons were both graduates of the Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary.

In 2019, the ELCA Churchwide Assembly added June 17 to our church calendar of commemorations as a day of repentance for the martyrdom of the Emanuel Nine. Congregations of the ELCA are encouraged reaffirm their commitment to repenting of the sins of racism and white supremacy, to venerate the martyrdom of the Emanuel Nine, and to mark this day of penitence with study and prayer.

On June 16, the Sunday nearest June 17, we will begin worship confessing the sin of racism and seeking God's guidance and grace as we strive for a more just world together.

Reconciling in Christ Sunday - Sunday, June 9



As a Reconciling in Christ congregation, we are encouraged to set aside one Sunday each year to give special attention to God's expansive and inclusive welcome to all, especially to people who hear "all are welcome" and think "yeah, all but me." Thus, it is important to name specifically that we welcome, include, and celebrate LGBTQIA2S+ people in our gathering here at Good Shepherd.

As part of this welcome, June 9's liturgy will intentionally feature slight variations of phrasing that highlight God's expansive love for all God's people. An example of this is the following translation of the Lord's Prayer:

Our Creator in heaven,
Let your name be sanctified
Let your realm come
Let your will happen in heaven
and also upon earth.

Give to us today our nourishment that is necessary for life And forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors.

Do not ever carry us into testing situations
But rescue us from the evil one.
For yours is the kin-dom,
the power, and the glory forever. Amen.

The meaning is exactly the same as the more traditional language, and with few slight adaptations we hear God's word in a new way.




Save the date – Worship in the park and picnic
