A Note from Your Pastor



Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return.

Grace to you and peace from God on the move...to the cross, out of the tomb, into the world.

One of my seminary professors, Father Michael Raschko, defined the human condition as "living in the creative tension between finite existence and infinite self-

transcendence." We live with the knowledge of death and the knowledge of death generates new life and new energy. How we live with the knowledge of death is the question: do we pretend like we won't die? Do we try to defeat death? Do we live knowing that we have already died the only death that matters, our death with Christ in the waters of baptism, trusting that God has overcome the power of death for us?

On Ash Wednesday, we receive a mark on our forehead that is a mark of God's love and a mark of our death. In a world that keeps death as far away as possible, it is both jarring and reassuring to receive the mark of the cross in ash and oil and hear that we are going to die, and in fact have already died with Christ in baptism. In a world that ignores death, it is comforting to acknowledge the fact that we die, that our worldly bodies will fail.

The knowledge of death frees us to go with God beyond that which traps us. When we focus on survival, when we focus on avoiding death, we close ourselves and our community off from the fullness of what God is doing and where God calls us to go. This is the beauty of Ash Wednesday – we are told directly and physically "you too will die" – and God moves in us to overcome the fear of death and live into the promise of new life.

Sundays in Lent, we call back to this proclamation and promise. We remember that we are dust and unto dust we shall return, and we encounter God on the move conquering the power of death. God is on the move in our hearts, in our congregation, and in our lives.

Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return.

Sermon Series for Lent "God is On The Move"





We again celebrate Maundy Thursday with Dinner Church style worship with First Lutheran. We hear the story of Jesus' last meal with his friends and his command to love one another while we have a meal in our fellowship hall. After the meal, we process into the sanctuary to linger with Christ in the garden as the altar is stripped.

Last year's ALT Easter Vigil was a fantastic gathering, beginning at the fire outside, processing by candlelight into the dark sanctuary, and staying in the tomb with Christ until we turned around to discover the lilies and trumpets of Easter. This year, we again host the Albany Lutherans Together Easter Vigil at Good Shepherd. We'll gather at the fire and light the paschal candle, hear the stories of God's salvation through time by candlelight, and celebrate the first communion of Easter together, ultimately culminating in a toast to the risen Christ and dessert potluck.


Altar Flowers: Sponsors Are Needed


BLOOD DONATIONS: DID YOU KNOW...?

- Less than 38% of Americans are eligible to give blood or platelets; of those, less than 10% actually donate each year.

Next Faith on Tap on March 12 @ 7:45 pm





WELCA News: History of Bold Women's Day

Bold Women's Day was established by the Women of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in American (WELCA) in 2007. This annual Celebration, observed on the first Sunday of March, honors Lutheran women who act boldly in their faith through various forms of service, advocacy, and hospitality. WELCA was formed in 1987, bringing together three predecessor organizations: the American Lutheran Church Women, the Lutheran Church Women, and Women in Action for Mission. Since its inception the organization has been dedicated to empowering women to grow in faith, affirm their gifts, support one another, and engage in ministry and action.

Bold Women's Day encourages congregations to recognize and celebrate the contributions of women who live out their faith in impactful ways. The celebration includes special liturgies, worship services and community events providing resources to help congregations honor the bold women in their midst. This year, Bold Women's Day is celebrated on Sunday March 2.

Message from Personnel Committee ~ Good Shepherd Newsletter: Announcement of Changes

With the retirement of Kathy Flynn, our Administrative Assistant, coupled with planning for managing the office workload in the short term, the Personnel Committee has been exploring various options. These options were focused on effectively maintaining a high level of communications, streamlining the office work process, and being mindful of costs.

We have recommended instituting a bi-monthly newsletter instead of the more familiar monthly issue. We have additionally recommended to outsource the publication of the newsletter to a highly recommended church publishing concern called SamePage Communications. St. John's has been using SamePage with excellent results. SamePage produces a document which we will be proud of, and which will enhance Good Shepherd's communication and outreach. We are pleased to announce that the Church Council approved the Personnel Committee's recommendation.

SamePage will produce for us in the near term three bi-monthly newsletters this year (March/April, May/June, July/August) as we continue to look at the longer term of how to manage the Church office and how we will staff the Administrative Assistant position. The cost of each outsourced bi-monthly newsletter is \$450. The cost is within the approved budget in lieu of not having the expense of the Administrative Assistant at this time. If we decide to continue to outsource the newsletter to SamePage beyond the first three issues, we will look at funding those costs when that decision is made.

Beyond improving communications and streamlining the office process, instituting these changes with the newsletter will lessen the administrative burden on Pastor Chilton so he can focus on spiritual leadership and enhancing our ministry.

The retirement of Kathy has offered us the opportunity to evaluate not only the publication of the newsletter but the necessary long-term staffing of the office as we look to become more efficient and cost effective. Additionally, we are excited that this change will enhance our ministry and spiritual life. The Personnel Committee is eager to hear congregant feedback on the newsletter.
