A note from the Pastor

Ecclesia Semper Reformanda – the church must always be reformed

Since the beginning of the church, we have been constantly reforming and renewing the church. The earliest days of Christian assembly modified existing practices of Jewish, Greek, and Roman gatherings. As witnesses of the resurrection carried the gospel to the ends of the earth, the church continued to reform, adapting to the current place and time.

Over the next two months, we are celebrating the ongoing reformation of the church in worship, fellowship, and service. On October 13, we are having Breakfast Church, a style of worship that is a callback to the supper clubs of early Christian worship. We gather around a meal, talk about faith and life, and celebrate communion all together.

On October 20, the **3rd Sunday Faith Formation** meeting is all about praying with beads to focus our prayer, and then on October 27, we celebrate **Reformation Sunday** and say **farewell to our Music Director**, Anita Andersen. We give thanks for her years of service to the congregation and wish her well.

On November 3, we are gathering with First Lutheran for a joint

worship service for All Saints Sunday followed by a German Dinner themed potluck. During this meal, we'll also have the opportunity to sign letters to legislators advocating for climate policy changes to support wholeness for all creation. Later in November, the **annual prayer vigil**, on November 26, will be adjusted a little to start with Morning Prayer at 7 am and conclude with sung Compline (Night Prayer) at 7pm, led by St. John's Collegium and followed by a pie social (more on this next month).

The church is always reforming, reorienting ourselves toward God in new ways, may it always be so.

Sunday School News

We welcome children of all ages to Sunday School to spark their interest in the Bible! The Sunday School has a new look and feel this Fall! We are using the SPARK curriculum which introduces a bible story over a period of 3 to 4 weeks. Each week we will introduce the story in a different manner through games, crafts, acting,

science, music and storytelling. This has so many benefits for the children and most importantly, they will enjoy each learning activity while reinforcing the Bible stories they will remember for many years to come!

For the first 6 weeks of Sunday School, we have focused on **Creation**. We have used instruments, taken a nature walk, incorporated science activities on wind, stars and moon, been singing and dancing to "He's got the whole world in his hands", and as part of our music week, Emmie Knobloch has been teaching our older youth the bell chimes! (The youth shared this song with us in worship on September 29!).

Sunday School is off on October 13th due to Indigenous Peoples' Day / Columbus Day Weekend. We're back on October 20th with a three-week unit exploring **Noah's Ark**. We can't wait to share new learning activities associated with this unit.

To members our congregation- come be part of this exciting new method of teaching our children. It is a limited commitment on a rotating basis. A lesson plan will be provided as a resource. Each of us has talents to share and you can decide whether you'd like to introduce the lesson through reading the Bible or playacting ...or storytelling, do music, science or lead a game or craft. If you'd like to see what this involves, come join us for a few minutes during the Sunday School time. Be prepared - it will bring a smile to your face!

Making a Difference with Your Financial Contributions

For the month of October, the set of offering envelopes includes an envelope for the Endowment Fund. The Endowment Fund was established in 1985. Disbursements are made annually for capital improvements, debt reduction or building programs of Good Shepherd; scholarships to members for church-related study; community needs; or for missions of the Lutheran Church at home or overseas. In 2023, the Church Council approved the Endowment Fund Committee's recommendations to donate \$1,200 to the following organizations: Good Shepherd Building Repair Fund - \$300, Good Shepherd Little Food Pantry - \$300, Animal Protective Foundation - \$300, Lutheran Immigration Refugee Service \$300. The Fund has distributed over \$31,000 to many local charities and missions of the Lutheran Church and has a current balance of approximately \$61,000. A donation to the Endowment Fund is a gift that keeps giving. Thank you for making a difference with your financial support!

Climate Policy Advocacy Opportunity

ELCA Statement on Environment has called for us to care for Creation because we are full participants, and we should imitate the way God cares for Creation. We can carry out this responsibility by influencing and supporting the work that our local, state, and federal governments have employed to protect the earth's resources and meet the basic needs of all creatures.

On Sunday, November 3, we will offer an opportunity to sign letters to our elected officials who have a role in institutionalizing protections for all creation. The letters will specifically address the programs each of them must decide to support.

The service that day will be a joint service of First Lutheran and Good Shepherd Churches, followed by our traditional German dinner. Plan to spend a few moments signing letters prepared by FLC's Social Ministry Team to send to all those elected to serve us.


