A Note from Your Pastor



Remember the hope you have in God: hope that is the unquiet heart that contradicts the present; hope that moves you out of the confines of death and tombs of the past and moves you into God's future, a future of abundant love, boundless grace, and inclusion, respect, and dignity for all people, and all creation. ~ Pastor Chilton's Easter Message

Dear church,

Fred Kaan's excellent hymn "Let us talents and tongues employ" (ELW #674) was published in 1975 and entered ELCA worship books in With One Voice, the blue hymnal supplement published in 1995. The refrain, "Jesus lives again, earth can breathe again, pass the Word around: loaves abound," especially evokes for me the hope I have in Christ, the abundant grace of God's love and hope that groans against the oppression of the world. When I feel especially overwhelmed by the powers that conspire against God, when I struggle to remember the hope I have in Christ, the refrain of the hymn comes to me, and I can breathe again and I'm moved into action.

Though they were moved into action by the resurrection, during the first Eastertide, from the day of the resurrection to the day of Pentecost, the disciples prepared. They were sent to be witnesses and evangelists, yes, but they didn't rush out there unprepared. They encountered the living Christ. They prayed together. They chose Matthias to join the twelve, filling out the central leadership of their mission. They got ready to go and make disciples, teaching and baptizing. They took the time for the hope in Christ that struggles against the unfulfilled present to dwell in their hearts and move them to action for God's future. They prepared for the mission we all share: giving thanks and praise to God and bearing God's creative and redeeming word to all the world.

This Eastertide, let us prepare. Let us remember the hope we have in Christ. Let us encounter the risen Christ in our midst. Let us notice where the world groans for relief and hope. Let us prepare to step boldly into God's future, sure of the hope we have in Christ. Hope that contradicts the present and moves us to advocate for immigrants, to feed the hungry and house the homeless, to preach the good news of abundant grace always, and if necessary to use words (to paraphrase St. Francis of Assisi). Let us sing for joy and pass the Word around.

Alleluia! Christ is risen!

Amen.

Good Shepherd Sunday Celebrated on May 11

The Fourth Sunday of Easter is always Good Shepherd Sunday in the lectionary. Because April 16, Good Shepherd's anniversary date, sometimes falls during the Holy Week, and since the lectionary gives us a great day to mark annually as Good Shepherd Sunday, at April's Council meeting we decided to start treating the Fourth Sunday of Easter as the congregation anniversary day. Please join us on May 11. This year we mark 64 years of the congregation. We'll sing "Good Shepherd, You Have Been Our Faithful Guide," a hymn commissioned for the 50th Anniversary in 2011, and we'll give thanks for the history and look to the future in the liturgy. We will also have an elevated fellowship hour after worship. Be sure to join us!

NEW! Join us for ALT: Sundays Together! First One to Be Held on June 22 at St. John's

What a joy it was to worship together this Lent and Easter! Each week in Lent, we gathered from all four of our congregations for supper and evening prayer, sharing the Christian life with each other across congregations. On Holy Saturday, for the second year in a row, all four of our congregations came together for the Great Vigil of Easter. We sang together. We prayed together. We experienced the profundity of heavy rain arriving in the middle of Karen Lapierre reading the prophet Isaiah's words about God bringing water to the thirsty. We toasted the risen Christ together.

To keep this energy and collaboration going and not wait until Advent to worship together again, we're going to try an experiment this year: four Sundays, between now and next March, on which all four congregations worship together on Sunday morning. These are going to be normal Sundays, avoiding high festivals, Advent, and Lent.

We're not juggling times and scheduling worship leaders from all the churches. The plan is simply this: about once a quarter, all four congregations will worship together at one congregation's location and time, and in that congregation's normal way of worshiping.

The first ALT: Sunday Together is June 22. On this day, we will all join St. John's for worship at 9:30 am (303 Sand Creek Road, Albany). First, Good Shepherd, and Holy Spirit won't have worship at their building that day, and all the pastors will be at St. John's, with everyone else. Mark your calendars now and plan to join us for our future dates:

September 21 at Good Shepherd January 4 at Holy Spirit March 1 at First Lutheran

We have such great worship together, let's keep that going on Sundays Together and keep growing and walking in faith as Albany Lutherans Together!






Musical Celebration at GS in Glenville on May 3

CROP Hunger Walk at St. Vincent on May 4

The 45th Annual John U. Miller Memorial CROP Hunger Walk will be held on Sunday, May 4. Please note it will start and end at a new location: St. Vincent de Paul Church, 900 Madison Ave., Albany.

Registration begins at 1:30 pm.

(One hour later than in the past.) Music is in the sanctuary until Opening Ceremonies at 2:15 pm, with the official start of the walk at 2:30 pm. You have a choice of two routes: a two and a quarter mile loop with a rest stop at Blessed Sacrament Church on Central Ave., and the shorter Golden Mile. Refreshments will be available at St. Vincent's after the Walk.

In 2024, the CROP walk raised \$102,616. Of that, a total of \$25,654 was distributed to 25 food pantries and soup kitchens in the county of Albany, NY, and to the Food Pantry in Rensselaer county. In 2025, the CROP Hunger Walk is aiming to raise \$104,500.

ORLC Celebrates 100th Anniversary on May 17


Our Redeemer Lutheran Church in Scotia will celebrate its 100th anniversary on Saturday, May 17, and all are invited!



Book Discussion: *How We Learn to Be Brave* Join us Mondays at 7 pm via Zoom: May 5-26

On January 21, 2025, many Americans were introduced to the Rt. Rev. Mariann Edgar Budde, bishop of the Episcopal Diocese of Washington, by way of her sermon at the inaugural prayer service at the National Cathedral. In her sermon, Bishop Budde addressed the president directly imploring him "to have mercy on the people in our country who are scared now," from those who are part of the LGBTQ+ community to immigrants and refugees.

For Bishop Budde, this moment was the culmination of a lifetime spent thinking about those pivot points when we're called on to push past our fears and act with strength. In her book she teaches us that being brave is not a singular occurrence; it's a journey that we can choose to undertake every day.

How We Learn to Be Brave is an inspirational guide to the key junctures in life that, if navigated with faith and discernment, pave the way for us to become our most courageous selves — providing much-needed fortitude and insight to anyone searching for answers in uncertain times.


Join St. John's on Monday evenings at 7:00 pm via Zoom at stjohnsalbany.org/zoom as we delve into this book:


